

National Webinar on IPR

Department of Economics of Rangia College organised a National Webinar on 'Intellectual Property Rights' on 30th November/ 2020. Professor M P Bezbaruah of Gauhati University, Dr Walter Fernandes, Director of North Eastern Social Research Centre, Guwahati and Dr Bhupal Bhattacharya, of Department of Law, Raiganj University, West Bengal were the invited speaker.

Dr Brajendra Saikia, Honourable Principal of Rangia College, in his inaugural address highlighted the importance of the topic of the webinar and appraised the house about some recent developments in the field. Professor M P Bezbaruah explained the nature and types of Intellectual Property and dwelt upon the implications and consequence of the TRIP Agreement in India. Dr. Walter Fernandes explained how lack of assignment of property rights of traditional knowledge preserved by communities allowed rampant piracy of such knowledge by big corporates, especially the pharmaceutical companies. He called for measures for conferring of property rights of traditional knowledge on communities. Dr. Bhattacharya highlighted various legal issues related to different forms of Intellectual Property such as copy right, trade mark, patent and geographical indication. Participants comprised of College Teachers and Research Scholars from Assam, Tripura and West Bengal.

While Dr. Jayashri Sarma, Senior Assistant Professor of Economics anchored the session, Md. Mofidul Hassan and Dr. Ujjal Pratim Dutta, Faculty Members of the Department, introduced the invited speakers. The event ended with a vote of thank offered by Dr. Dinesh Lahkar, Head of the Department of Economics of the college.


