ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- ❖ Submission of Admission application form and Admission for the academic session 2022-23 in Rangia College will be Online (Website: www.rangiacollege.ac.in)
- ❖ The applicant must upload scanned copies of necessary documents (admit card, pass certificate, Marksheet, caste certificate Passport size photograph) , Gap certificate if the candidate is not from present session. The gap certificate has to be issued by the Head of Institution (Govt. Institution only) last attended. Gap exceeding two year will not be accepted.
- ❖ Admission to the College will be strictly on merit basis and subject to the approval of the Admission Committee, Rangia College.
- ❖ **To apply for TDC 1st Semester Admission the applicant must have minimum percentage of marks in H. S. Final Examination as shown below:**

45% for B.A.

55% for B.Sc.

40% for B.Com.

- ❖ **The submission of application with above Percentage (%) does not mean admission of applicant is confirmed in respective course. Admission procedure will be strictly on merit basis according to seat capacity of College.**

- ❖ Students must follow the subject combination as mentioned in the information brochure 2022-2023 which is available in the college Website: (www.rangiacollege.ac.in). Applicant must be very careful while entering subject combination in the online application form.
- ❖ There is reservation of seats as per Govt. norms for ST, SC, OBC, MOBC, and differently abled, NCC, NSS, the candidates excelling in Extra Co-curricular activities, Son/Daughter of Present & Ex Employee of Rangia College, Fringe Village (i.e., Shahan, Bongaon & Dahara only), Ex-Serviceman, Tea Tribes, EWS, Adibashi & International Students. Candidate will have to mention in the admission form the category of reservation and must submit valid documents.
- ❖ The valid document with the signature of competent authority only will be considered for the above mentioned reservation seats.
- ❖ Bank account number with name of branch and IFSC code, mobile number and email address of applicant is must. Applicant has to use the same Mobile number while applying for admission.
- ❖ Any invalid or wrong information regarding marks and certificate will be punishable according to law.

General Rules for the maintenance of discipline

1. All students must follow the instructions of the College Authority. Any violation of the instructions will be considered a serious offence.

**IMPORTANT GUIDELINES FOR THREE YEAR DEGREE COURSE
UNDER SEMESTER SYSTEM WITH 'UNDER GRADUATE CHOICE BASED CREDIT
SYSTEM' (UG-CBCS)**

1. A TDC will consist of 6 (Six) Semesters covering three Calendar Years. The Schedule for UG-CBCS (Semester System) shall be as follow :
 - a) First, Third and Fifth Semester (Odd Semester) June - November
(Including Examination)
 - b) Second, Fourth and Sixth Semester (Even Semester) December - May
(Including Examination)
2. Students' performance will be monitored throughout the semester by continuous assessment in their concerned subjects. Evaluation of the students' performance in each of the theory and practical paper will be based on the following :
Internal Evaluation: 20%
External Evaluation: 80%
3. Internal evaluation will be done by the concerned Deptt. following G.U. guidelines and this evaluation will be based on Attendance, Group Discussion/Assignment/Field Work/Seminar and Sessional Examination.
4. External evaluation will be done through a Final Examination towards the end of semester.
5. The pass marks in each theory paper is 30% and in each practical paper is 40%.
6. In each paper, students must secure pass marks in both the internal as well as the external evaluation separately.
7. A student who could not appear or failed in any semester examination will be allowed to clear the same as follows:
 - (a) First Semester with the regular Third Semester Examination.
 - (b) Second Semester with the regular Fourth Semester Examination.
 - (c) Third Semester with the regular Fifth Semester Examination.
 - (d) Fourth Semester with the regular Sixth Semester Examination.
8. A student may be allowed once to reappear in one of the honours theory papers in each of the First, Second and Third Semesters for betterment of marks if the candidate secured pass mark in all papers. Students will be allowed to reappear only in the next similar examination.
9. No repeat/betterment will be allowed in the practical Examination in any semester.
10. A student must pass all his/her Semester examinations, including "Repeat" and "Betterment" chances within six years from the date of admission of the First Semester course.
11. In Semester system, there is no scope for a student to appear as a Private candidate in any Subject.

N.B.: The existing rules that govern the UG-CBCS (Semester System) are subject to change/ modification as per Gauhati University notification from time to time.

1. MIL (Assamese/Bodo/Bengali/Hindi)/Alternative English, English & Environmental Studies are compulsory for all subjects.
2. Students can select four elective subjects (one of them will be fourth elective subject as per AHSEC rule) from the table given below.

Commerce

1. MIL (Assamese/Bodo/Hindi)/Alternative English, English & Environmental Studies are compulsory for all subjects.
2. Business Studies and Accountancy are two compulsory elective subjects.
3. A student can select two other elective subjects (one of them will be fourth elective subject as per AHSEC rule) from the table given below.

4. Core course: A Core Course is a course that has to be compulsorily studied.

5. Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC): These courses are mandatory for every student.

6. Generic Elective (GE) Course [Generic Elective for Honours (HG) Programme]:A Generic Elective Course is offered by an unrelated discipline/subject. That is, a student of Honours Programme can choose a Generic Elective course from any other discipline/subject except from the Honours Core itself.

7. Credit: A system for computation of work load for a course and it is calculated on the basis of a total teaching period required for the course. Generally, for Theory classes, 1 credit is 1 theory period of one hour duration and for Practical classes, 1 credit is 1 practical period of two hour duration. Here, the No. of credit implies No. of classes in a week.

Subject under **Generic Elective Course** for **B.A.** Honours/**B.Sc.** Honours in different semesters will be the subject different from Core Course and the option for selection of Generic Elective subject in Honours Programme - 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th semesters of **B.A./ B.Sc.** and in Regular Programme - 5th and 6th semesters of **B.A.** will be notified by the College authority.

For 3rd and 4th Semesters (Honours& Regular Programme) –

Subjects of **Core Course (Honours Core- HC)** for B.A./ B.Sc. **Honours Programme** in 3rd and in 4th semesters are same as that of Honours Programme in 1st semester.

There will be **Skill Enhancement Course (SEC)** with 1 Paper in 3rd and in 4th semesters of **B.A./B.Sc.** Honours& Regular Programme. Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) in different semesters (1 Paper per semester) will be provided by the concerned department. Generally, the subject of SEC is chosen from subject of Core Course.

Students of **B.A./B.Sc.** Honours Programme will also study Generic Elective Course (1 Paper per semester) in 3rd and in 4th semesters.

For **Regular Programme in B.Sc.** 3rd and 4th semesters, 3 subjects of Core Course (Regular **Core-RC**) are same as the subjects of the Core Course (*i.e.*, **RC**) for Regular Programme in B.Sc. 1st semester.

For **Regular Programme in B.A.**, 2 subjects for Core Course (**Regular Core-RC**) in 3rd semester and 2 subjects for the Core Course (Regular Core-RC) in 4th semester are same as the 2 subjects for Core Course (Regular Core-RC) in 1st semester B.A. Regular Programme. They will also study **MIL Compulsory/Alternative English Compulsory** as the subject of Core Course (**Regular Core -RC**) in both 3rd and 4th semesters.

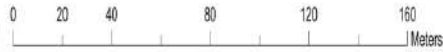
